

CLEMSON POLICE ADVISORY BOARD MINUTES

Date: Thursday, June 25, 2026

Members in Attendance: Winton Hunter, Kevin Dull, Elaine Masceri, Sandy Edge, Paul Schleifer, Camryn MacAlarney(CU rep), Agastya Sharma(HS Rep) and Chief Campos.

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by Co-Chair Kevin Dull @ 6:00pm.

Roll Call: Roll was called by Co-Chair Kevin Dull. Madam Chair Lisa Robinson and Pablo Unda have excused absences.

Approval of Agenda: Motion made by Elaine Masceri, Seconded by Paul Schleifer. Motion passed.

Approval of previous meeting minutes – May 28, 2026: Elaine Masceri made a motion to approve. Paul Schleifer seconded. Motion carried.

Citizen Comments: No citizen's comments or questions presented.

Department Status / Staffing Review: Chief Campos provided a synopsis of current matters with the Department.

- Council approved two new officer positions and one new Dispatch position with those numbers:
 - Two dispatch positions open
 - 5 officer positions open
- Two officers that are at the academy
- No one in FTO at the moment
- The new fiscal year budget will start July 1, 2026 and we will move forward with what the council has approved.

Crime Review: Chief Campos gave a rundown of the crime stats for April.

- One robbery
- 8 simple assault
- 2 breaking and entering
- 6 thefts from motor vehicles
- 5 mv thefts
- 14 DUI arrests
- 4800 calls for service
- 732 traffic stops
- 413 citations
- 53 arrests

Newest board members introduced. Camryn MacAlarney (CU representative) and Agastya Sharma (HS representative from Daniel HS)

Discuss City Ordinance 18-27: References designated parking and regulation for ride shares. Ordinance has been in place prior to 2020 as a reaction to an incident in Columbia where someone mistakenly got into a vehicle they thought was their ride share. Designated areas have cameras, etc. Uber and Lyft have done a lot to make their operations safer for passengers since then. They are not very responsive to us when they are told they cannot go through certain areas during events. Downtown streetscape project is also ongoing and there are a lot of changes that have made the ordinance

outdated. Chief Campos is asking the board to have a discussion to make a recommendation to remove this ordinance and let the commerce continue without putting restrictions on where they can pick up and drop off. State law already regulates some things, such as they cannot block traffic, etc. Removing the ordinance would just remove restrictions other than what state law already regulates. Kevin Dull suggested discussing this further at the next meeting. Chief Campos will keep the topic on the agenda for the next meeting.

Discuss Changing Board Position to include University personnel: Under Ordinance 2-64 is the required composition of the board. Chief Campos is suggesting the possibility of changing one of the positions to a CU rep that can speak to the quality of life, or finding a way to communicate with those people to have them come to the meetings to speak on issues. Next month the new Associate Dean of Students and Director and Office of Community & Ethical Standards will speak.

Requested Presentations: Chief Campos advised maybe the new CU fire chief in Aug or Sept when CU makes an appointment.

Board Member Open Discussion: Paul Schleifer asked how we will get through the concerts shorthanded. Chief Campos advised it will be all hands on deck. CUPD advised they have announced publicly for concert goers to have a plan on how to get there and how to leave, hydrate, and have patience. Some people are planning to hang out by their vehicles for a while to let traffic dissipate. We have already had reports of some parking scams.

Adjournment: Motion made by Paul Schleifer to adjourn. Motion seconded by Winton Hunter. Motion Carried.
