Public Comments:

Ann Fuhr:

Lives at Clemson Downs. She was impressed by the NWF effort by the sustainability Committee. She asked Chris about Mosquito Spraying, and if it would be antagonistic to this end. She has a personal anecdote about family members always watching the fireflies in clemson. But the Butterflies and Fireflies are no longer around; and a Beekeeper friend has lost all of his bees. She notices that Clemson does not practice Measure to support our pollinator wildlife, such as not raking leaves too early.

Clemson Downs would like to become a NWF certified location.

For the mosquito spraying, the City recommends that citizens keep their pets indoors and to stay inside. So she is concerned about the spray. She researched the chemicals, and as a previous cancer board member, she sees an issue with some of the chemicals within the spray.

She wants to know what people can do so that they can protect themselves and their habitat for the sake of the insects. She urges the City to look into publishing a resource to show people how to promote pollinators and how to protect themselves from mosquito bites. (Eukalyptus)

Martin Hamilton:

Botanical Gardens Executive director. Botanist/Horticulturist. SCBC plans to host a Sustainability Fair in 2026 and has applied for funding from Pickens County. The event will be the weekend after Earth Day – April 24-25 2026.

Trying to get clemson extension to table and give information.

Worked in Royal Gardens in Britain - while there, saw that there are small businesses nearby. This would give a voice to local businesses who don't have a large advertising budget to sustainability minded people.
